

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A pedestrian crossing in the village near the Post Office is urgently needed. Crossing to the Church from the PO side with a buggy or similar is hazardous. A259 is not a dual carriageway but is treated as such along Felpham Way from Downview Road to the Leisure Centre roundabout where large numbers of cars do a u-turn to cut in.

Northern relief road. A proper one is needed. The present so called one is a pigs breakfast- houses being built along it, dog-leg onto existing roads e.g. A259, Rowan Way - and a new improved plan should be pressed for now! By the time anything is done the new relief road will be overloaded and obstructing Bognor bound traffic on the A29.

Speed reduction in Downview Road is an urgent need. There needs to be a road link north from the Arun Leisure Centre.

Cycleways and footpaths need to be improved to Inspire Felpham (Arun Leisure Centre), particularly on the northern side of A259 between the roundabout and Downview Road.

Pedestrian crossing outside the post office

Very important that Felpham keeps the Grassmere carpark for staff at the shops and residents parking

Too many people use pavements for cycling, young and old. Cycle lanes on pavements would help

Public footpaths have been neglected over the past years and should be signed and maintained better

Upkeep of road surfaces which are still poor in certain areas.

Maintain free parking areas

Can anything be done about the people using Limmer Lane as a rat run. It is lethal! Would it be possible to introduce sleeping policemen or some form of traffic calming system or a 20mph speed limit.

20 mph over all village roads

Limmer Lane needs a pavement along its length. It is used by many people, some with buggies and babies

After June 2012, resolution of flood issues is a priority. Both for individual properties and emergency access requirements.

20mph speed limit for centre of village and (at least) Limmer Lane.

Concern at increased traffic at local schools. Huge disappointment that the bypass has not been done this year


Bypass to Chichester should be finished NOW - help congestion through Felpham

More flexible community meeting facilities for local activities and events



If the conservation area is reviewed care is needed to ensure what is currently conserved is retained. I have heard that conservation area reviews have been used to permit unsuitable development

Church Field must continue as a green belt between Felpham and Bognor. Adequate infrastructure must come before housing. Any new housing must be carefully planned and severely limited. Felpham is already full.

The distinctive boundaries of Felpham must be maintained on the Western A259 side. In-filling of new housing in the area on gardens etc. must stop as the existing infrastructure i.e. never improved to cope with it.

Too many houses with too many cars without facilities to cope which are all suffocating Felpham

No more development on agricultural land

Keep church filed free from development it is an important buffer between Felpham and Bognor

Must emphasise the protection of Church Field as a green belt between Felpham and Bognor. Retain as an undeveloped open site

No more houses to be built

Don't need any more houses

Burial space is a priority for Felpham as limited life is left in St Mary's churchyard - a few years at the most

No more estates not even small ones. Save Church Field as a green, open space within the conservation area

Enable more supported housing for elderly


Encourage building on brown field sites - not agricultural land. Some infill will be necessary.

Anything that can be done to improve the quality of the buildings of all our schools


Children should be encouraged to walk to school. They should also be taught how to use a rubbish bin.

Need to keep shops open for a living village. Business rates?


The likes of Tesco should be fought to the bitter end.

No residential building on open spaces on the seafront please. If we must allow cycling along Felpham Promenade then a marked cycle lane must be painted onto the promenade (as they have in Brighton). I would personally not allow cycling as the prom is too narrow, with corners in places

Floodlighting of the whole promenade / seafront between Summerley Lane and Gloucester Road

Would like to see a cycle lane along the promenade to stop cyclists weaving in and out of pedestrians. No more beach huts to be erected on the greensward at Felpham beach

Is cycling on the prom a problem? I am not sure it is. Some form of parking for King George playing field

Be like Worthing and have an actual designated cycle path clearly marked painted and signed

Cycling on the promenade - please mark out a path to be kept to

Some control on indiscriminate cycling on the promenade

Light the unlighted section of promenade towards Bognor. Provide better sailing and water sports facilities


Seafront is a key asset for our village, and tourist revenue

Felpham needs a central play area for children. The existing facilities are all at the edges. Church field or the allotment site would be an ideal site. Housing estates in Felpham do not have the green spaces found in other parts of the country. A visit to Newport Pagnell housing estate would be educational - lots of housing but also green spaces, play areas etc

Western area open space should be considered, cannot allocate a priority to this. Brown field development, even, should only be considered if there is a pressing need - Felpham is already full

More artistic or public art that reflects the character of the Parish, e.g. a Blakes Trail or cycle (ability) route. Make the open spaces less boring via an artistic trail that informs people about the heritage of the area - a 'doomsday to the future' information trail.

No more development the infrastructure is saturated

Unfortunately the houses are too close together so open nature is rather a myth

Green spaces must be kept to ensure Felpham does not become one big housing development

Kids would love a skateboard BMX/ramp in Longbrook Park

Church Field as a park - our last chance

Provide better car parking for parks Better lighting for Longbrooke Park

Need to make sure parks are used, not just for dog walkers - young people, sports etc

Opens spaces to be used, particularly by young people e.g. football, not just for dog walkers

#### Is there anything else that you consider to be important.

Consider means to encourage return of quality shops to village including bakery and greengrocer. Link to schools to stop litter problem and encourage pupil involvement in community and respect for their town.

Felpham has so much to offer - the enhancement of Blakes Road for sailing, leisure and restaurants should be considered in a constructive way. A large piece of distinctive public art at Blakes Road would be excellent. If it reflected the 'Green and Pleasant Land and looked to the sea and the 'Downs' it could be attractive and a reflection of the village and everything the area has to offer.

Some form of traffic calming in Limmer Lane. It is used as a rat run mornings and evenings to avoid Downview lights

20mph through the village

It must maintain its individual identity and not become a suburb of Bognor

New trading estate with road onto A259 so what is the point of the relief road?

Felpham in Focus - could include a listing of all retail outlets, restaurants and services. A complete listing would help all to know the full range of facilities.

To prevent it becoming part of an even larger urban sprawl

Keep on liaising with residents about the NP to keep them up to date

Get rid of the car culture. Provide much better and safer pedestrians and cyclists. Crossings, pavements, bus shelters and seating for pedestrians. Cycle ways, racks and priorities for cyclists.

Road access into Bognor could be improved if traffic flow around roundabout at Hotham Park was improved - e.g. two lanes for westbound entry (fewer traffic jams)

Somehow enhancing the feeling of belonging and pride in being part of Felpham and caring about people in Felpham.. I don't thing we ever recovered our own identity when all the villages came under the umbrella of Bognor Regis Being close to Bognor Regis town (and Butlins) and our increasing population increases our need to ensure we are seen to be different or we will continue to lose our own identity. No easy when Felpham is greater than Felpham Village
